## Related Pins

16 triangle squares, each  $3\frac{1}{8}$ ".  
Cut each square  $3\frac{7}{8}$ ", Sew 2 together  
rt. sides together,  $\frac{1}{4}$ " on either side of  
diagonal cutting line. (I found it easier  
to cut them 4" and trim triangle square  
to  $3\frac{1}{8}$ " )

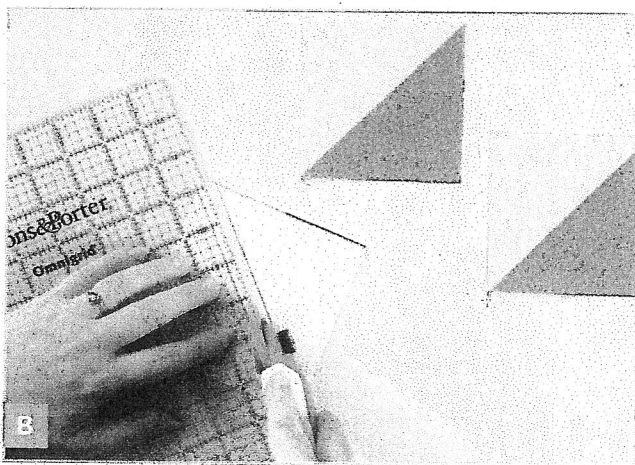
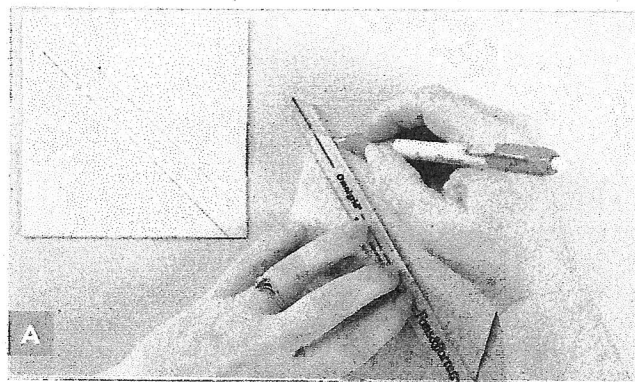
# Quick Triangle-Squares

The Fons & Porter Quarter Inch Seam Marker offers a neat way to mark accurate sewing lines for this method.

1. From 1 light and 1 dark fabric, cut 1 square  $\frac{7}{8}$ " larger than the desired finished size of triangle-square.
2. Place Quarter Inch Seam Marker diagonally across wrong side of light square, positioning yellow center line exactly at corners. Mark stitching guidelines along both sides of Quarter Inch Seam Marker (*Photo A*).

**NOTE:** If you are not using the Fons & Porter Quarter Inch Seam Marker, draw a diagonal line from corner to corner across square. Then draw sewing lines on each side of the first line,  $\frac{1}{4}$ " away.

3. Place light square on dark square, right sides facing; stitch along marked sewing lines.
4. Cut between rows of stitching to make 2 triangle-squares (*Photo B*). Press seam allowances toward darker fabric.
